SECTION 1118 LOCAL EDUCATIONAL AGENCY POLICY

IN GENERAL - Each local educational agency that receives Title I funds shall develop jointly with, agree upon with, and distribute to, parents of participating children a written parent involvement compact that establishes the expectations for parent involvement.

As a component of the school-level parental involvement policy developed under Title I, Jackson Park Elementary has been provided with Project Appleseed's school-parent compact, the Parental Involvement Pledge. The Pledge outlines how parents will share the responsibility for improved student achievement and the means by which the school and parents will build and develop a partnership to help children achieve the State's high standards. Jackson Park Elementary has demonstrated Title I parental involvement compliance

(1) By communicating to parents the school's responsibility to provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the children served under Title I to meet the State's student performance standards, and the ways in which each parent will be responsible for supporting their children's learning, such as monitoring attendance, homework completion, television watching, volunteering in their child's classroom, and participating as appropriate in decisions relating to the education of their children, and positive use of extracurricular time; and

(2) By addressing the importance of communication between teachers and parents on an ongoing basis through, at a minimum -

(A) Employing the Parental Involvement Pledge and Report Card at parent teacher conferences at least annually, during which the compact can be discussed as the compact relates to the individual child's achievement;

(B) Providing frequent reports to parents on their children's progress; and

(C) Providing reasonable access to staff, opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class, and observation of classroom activities.
